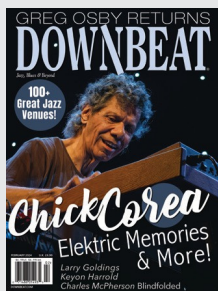

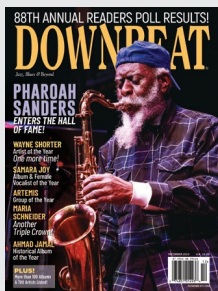

Danilo Pérez

For over three decades Grammy® Award Winning Panamanian Pianist-Composer Danilo Pérez has been lauded as one of the most creative forces in contemporary music. With Jazz as the anchoring foundation, Pérez's Global Jazz music is a blend of Panamanian roots, Latin American folk music, West African rhythms, European impressionism – promoting music as a borderless and multidimensional bridge between all people.



Born in Panama in 1965, Pérez started his musical studies when he was three years old with his father, a bandleader and singer. By age 10, he was studying the European classical piano repertoire at the National Conservatory in Panama. After receiving his bachelor's degree in electronics in Panama, he studied jazz composition at the prestigious Berklee College of Music. While still a student, he performed with Jon Hendricks, Terence Blanchard, Slide Hampton, Claudio Roditi and Paquito D'Rivera. Quickly established as a young master, he soon toured and/or recorded with artists such as Dizzy Gillespie United Nations Orchestra from 1989-1992, Jack DeJohnette, Steve Lacy, Lee Konitz, Charlie Haden, Michael Brecker, Joe Lovano, Tito Puente, Wynton Marsalis, Tom Harrell, Gary Burton, and Roy Haynes.

As a composer, Pérez has been commissioned by The Lincoln Center, Chicago Jazz Festival, and Imani Winds Quintet, among others. His octet for members of the Simón Bolívar Symphony Orchestra of Venezuela was commissioned by Carnegie Hall. In 2014, the Banff Centre commissioned Pérez to write a piano quintet for the Cecilia String Quartet titled "Camino de Cruces" and he also composed the music for the Museum of Biodiversity in Panama, designed by renowned architect Frank Gehry. In 2015, Pérez premiered another two new compositions: "Expeditions – Panamania 2015" was premiered at the Panamerican games in Toronto and his "Detroit World Suite – La Leyenda de Bayano" was premiered at the Detroit Jazz Festival.

Pérez has received a variety of awards for his musical achievements, activism and social work efforts. He is a recipient of the Doris Duke Artist Award in 2021, the United States Fellowship 2018, and the 2009 Smithsonian Legacy Award. He currently serves as UNESCO Artist for Peace, Cultural Ambassador to the Republic of Panama, Founder and Artistic Director of the Panama Jazz Festival, and the Berklee Global Jazz Institute in Boston's Berklee College of Music.

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John Clayton

Bassist, Composer, Arranger and Producer, John Clayton is a busy man. He is a Grammy© winner with nine additional nominations and has written and/or recorded with artists such as Milt Jackson, Diana Krall, Paul McCartney, Regina Carter, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Gladys Knight, Queen Latifah, McCoy Tyner, Yo Yo Ma and Charles Aznavour, to name only a few.



John was the principal bassist in the Amsterdam Philharmonic Orchestra (The Netherlands) from 1980-1984. In 1986, John co-founded the Clayton-Hamilton Jazz Orchestra and rekindled The Clayton Brothers Quintet. In addition to his individual clinics and workshops, he also directs the educational components of Centrum, The Port Townsend Jazz Festival, and the Vail Jazz Workshop.

It is John's arrangement of the "Star Spangled Banner" that helped propel Whitney Houston in her 1990 performance at the Super Bowl (the recording went platinum). His recordings with the Clayton Brothers, the Clayton-Hamilton Jazz Orchestra, Milt Jackson, Monty Alexander, Count Basie and others are plentiful. John feels "I've been guided by a village of musicians who helped me understand the humility that goes along with playing music at the highest level you can. Ray Brown used to tell me to 'Learn how to play the bass!!' Just take care of the music and it will take care of you."

John Clayton, Jeff Hamilton and Jeff Clayton founded the Clayton-Hamilton Jazz Orchestra. The excitement of this powerful 19-piece band is the result of the band's stellar performances and John's writing. Their music is composed and arranged by John, and it is not unusual to hear his take on a composition by Jeff Hamilton or something from the Hamilton trio book.

Along with multiple Grammy© nominations, the orchestra is featured on recordings with Milt Jackson, Diana Krall, John Pizzarelli, Charles Aznavour, Ernie Andrews, Barbara Morrison, Natalie Cole and many more. People often describe their sound as being influenced by Ellington, Basie and Thad Jones. This would never be denied by the orchestra, but one listen lets you know that their voice is unique, distinct and impactful.



Ryan Middagh Jazz Orchestra

Comprised of world-class musicians based in Nashville, Tennessee, Ryan Middagh and his Jazz Orchestra seek to show that Music City is a great home for the large jazz ensemble.

The members of Middagh's ensemble include top-call studio musicians, touring artists, music educators, and fellow composers and arrangers. Ryan, a producer, saxophonist, composer, arranger and educator is Director of Jazz Studies at Vanderbilt University's Blair School of Music; a native of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Middagh has called Nashville home since 2007.

The jazz orchestra founded in early 2018 is a life-long dream as well as a vehicle for Middagh's compositions and arrangements. The ensemble has collaborated with special guests including Keb' Mo' and Wycliffe Gordon and works to feature the artists in the ensemble, such as saxophonists Jeff Coffin and Don Aliquo, and vocalist Bethany Merritt.

The mission of the Ryan Middagh Jazz Orchestra is to create high quality music, collaborate within and across musical genres, and educate our community about the diverse music called jazz.

Anat Cohen

Ever charismatic, prolific and inspired, Grammy-nominated clarinetist-saxophonist Anat Cohen has won hearts and minds the world over with her expressive virtuosity and delightful stage presence. The New York Times writes, “Ms. Cohen on the clarinet was a revelation. Using the clarinet’s upper register, she could evoke infectious joy. In the lower register, her playing could conjure a deep, soulful melancholy. On up-tempo numbers, her improvisations weren’t just bebop fast; they had a clarity and deep intelligence that is really quite rare. She made it look effortless, even as she was playing the most technically difficult of all the reed instruments... she took my breath away.”

Anat has been declared Clarinetist of the Year by the Jazz Journalists Association every year since 2007 and has also been named the top clarinetist in both the readers and critics polls in *DownBeat* for multiple years running. That’s not to mention years of being named Rising Star in the soprano and tenor saxophone categories in *DownBeat*, as well as Jazz Artist of the Year. In 2009, ASCAP awarded Anat a Wall of Fame prize for composition and musicianship, among other honors.


One June 14, 2019 the Anat Cohen Tentet reached a new crest in its evolution with its second recording - *Triple Helix*. The album’s centerpiece is a three-movement concerto composed for Cohen and the Tentet, by her longtime collaborator Oded Lev-Ari, the Tentet’s musical director and Cohen’s producer/label partner at Anzic. Commissioned by New York’s Carnegie Hall and Chicago’s Symphony Center for live world premieres earlier in 2019, “Triple Helix” won raves from The Chicago Tribune as “a work of considerable expressive reach” and a “sensuous tonal palette,” with Cohen “sounding like a musician transformed.”

However easy Anat makes it seem onstage, the mastery of any great art is a long, elusive challenge, and she teaches the fine points of jazz and the music of Brazil to budding students across North America, including recent residencies at Stanford, Oberlin, Michigan State University, University of California-San Diego, the Centrum Choro Workshop and California Brazil Camp. About her experiences onstage, in the classroom or just engaging with her listeners, Anat says: “Any day when I get to share music with people – other musicians, an audience – feels like a celebration to me.”



Oded Lev-Ari

Across a diverse range of work, GRAMMY-nominated composer Oded Lev-Ari showcases his own, individual soundprint, one of cinematic richness and open-hearted lyricism. He has created and collaborated on music that span recordings, stage, and media, reflecting a genre-bending sensibility, expansive creativity, and unique ability to bring out the best in his collaborators.



In 2019, Oded conducted the premiere of his work Triple Helix: Concerto for Clarinet and Ensemble - commissioned by Carnegie Hall and Symphony Center Presents in Chicago, featuring iconic clarinetist Anat Cohen. The piece was hailed as “an Everest” and “a significant addition to the clarinet repertoire” by the Chicago Tribune. The Anat Cohen Tentet, for which Lev-Ari is musical director, recorded the work on their GRAMMY-Nominated album, Triple Helix.

Oded has written more than 1000 arrangements and compositions for chamber and wind ensemble, big band and symphony orchestra, and a variety of jazz combos. In reviews for Anat Cohen’s album *Noir*, The Washington Post called the it “one of the finest jazz records of the year, thanks in large part to the arrangements by Oded Lev-Ari, which alternate from lush Gil Evans harmonies to hard-charging bebop to a laconic beauty that could accompany a moody European film;” and NPR’s Morning Edition chimed in, “The arrangements on *Noir* are anything but black – they are life-affirming and intriguing.” Billboard magazine labeled his work “outstanding.”

Oded – born in Tel Aviv but a longtime resident of New York City – released his debut album as a leader, *Threading*, in April 2015 via Anzic Records, the label he has owned and directed for the past decade alongside Anat Cohen.

Born in 1975, Lev-Ari graduated from Israel’s Thelma Yellin High School for the Arts before serving in the Israeli Defense Force Orchestra. From 1993 to 1996, he was house arranger for the Dan Shilon – Live! television talk show. Lev-Ari is a recipient of the America Israel Cultural Fund scholarship, and graduated with honors from New England Conservatory of Music, where he studied with Bob Brookmeyer and Tamara Brooks.

Jazz Festival in Malaysia, and toured in the U.S., Israel, Serbia, and Japan.

Sam Parnin is a composer and multi-instrumentalist who draws inspiration from many different traditions of music including classical, electronic, jazz, and afro-caribbean. His diverse catalog ranges from chamber works to big band, the latter of which has been featured on two self-produced EPs. Sam is pursuing a B.M. degree in music composition with minors in jazz and electronic music at Indiana University.

Michael R. Dudley Jr. Overture to The Before and After Times

Michael R. Dudley Jr. has developed a career branching across and defying conventions of genre. As a composer they have earned commissions through the Sphinx Organization, ASCAP, New York Youth Symphony, and American Composers Orchestra. They have also performed as a trumpet player with groups such as the Maria Schneider Orchestra and Christian McBride Big Band, and recorded on GRAMMY®-winning albums. Michael currently lives in Potsdam, NY where they serve as an Assistant Professor at SUNY Potsdam's Crane School of Music.

Danny Jonokuchi is a jazz trumpeter, vocalist, composer, arranger, producer, and educator, based in NYC & LA. His compositions and arrangements have been performed by an array of artists including Lady Gaga, Catherine Russell, Nicole Zuraitis, The Capitol Symphonie Orchester, The Jazz Orchestra of Philadelphia, The Airmen of Note, & The Nashville Pops Orchestra.

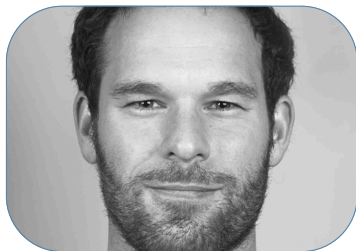
Zach Rich Broken Mirrors

Zach Rich is a multi-award-winning composer, trombonist and educator based in Denver, CO and current faculty at the DU Lamont school of music. His work has received awards from ASCAP, ASMAC, Downbeat Magazine, JEN, the Ravinia Festival, and Jazz at Lincoln Center. He has worked professionally with Billy Childs, Rufus Reid, Steve Wilson, the New York Youth Symphony and the Helsinki Jazz Orchestra, just to name a few. His latest album, "Solidarity", can be found on all streaming platforms.



Small Group Winner

Neil Carson Halloween (I + II)



Chicago-based composer/arranger/saxophonist Neil Carson has carved out a niche for himself through his unique rock-influenced medium/large ensemble writing. Neil's 9-piece band New Nostalgia has released 2 records, 9 singles and received a 4-star review in Downbeat, and is being honored with a SONIC Award at the 2024 ISJAC Symposium. Other recent projects have included arrangements for a forthcoming album by Chicago's Blueshift Big Band featuring the music of Nintendo composer Koji Kondo.

Arrangement Winner

Damiano Pascarelli Ornette's Clockwork

Michele Fernández

Michele Fernández is a published composer/arranger, active clinician/guest conductor, educator and performer. Before focusing on writing, she served as an oboist in the Miami area, and spent several years as a rhythm section member of a busy local Afro-Latin/Jazz ensemble. As a composer/clinician: Michele views writing and clinics as an opportunity to discuss important aspects of life, while also focusing on the art form of performance, and in so doing, to help others gain more self-confidence and an increased awareness of compassion for others that will lead to success in all areas of life.

Nick Smart

Head of Jazz at the Royal Academy of Music, Professor Nick Smart is an internationally renowned jazz educator, trumpeter and conductor who has given guest masterclasses and performances around the world.



Nick has performed alongside some of the leading names in jazz and was a member of the late Kenny Wheeler's Big Band with whom he had a long association and has just finishing co-writing Wheeler's biography. In 2013 he was awarded the Parliamentary Jazz Award for Jazz Education, in 2015 awarded Honorary Membership of the Royal Academy of Music, and in 2022 conferred with Professorship from the University of London as well as completing his PhD at the Academy. In addition to releasing three critically acclaimed albums as a leader, he has been equally in demand as both educator and musical director: leading projects with big bands all over Europe, as guest director of the Grahamstown Festival Big Band in South Africa, at Sydney Conservatory in Australia, and numerous residencies in North America focussing on Wheeler's music alongside Dave Holland.

Trumpeter Orbert Davis is co-founder, conductor and Artistic Director of Chicago Jazz Philharmonic, a 60-member, symphonic-jazz orchestra.

He served as jazz consultant and arranger for "Road to Perdition" starring Tom Hanks. He earned an Emmy Award for original music composed for the PBS documentary "DuSable to Obama: Chicago's Black Metropolis."

In 2017 he won a Jeff Award (music) for the TimeLine Theater production 'Paradise Blue.' Orbert hosts the weekly jazz radio show, "The Real Deal" on WDCB 90.9 FM (Chicago.)

Orbert earned a Bachelor's degree in trumpet performance from DePaul University, Masters degree in Jazz Pedagogy from Northwestern University as well an Honorary Doctorate from Governors State University.

Darcy James Argue

Darcy James Argue, "one of the top big band composers of our time" (Stereophile), is best known for Secret Society, an 18-piece group "renowned in the jazz world" (New York Times). Argue brings an outwardly anachronistic ensemble into the 21st century through his "ability to combine his love of jazz's past with more contemporary sonics" and is celebrated as "a syncretic creator who avoids obvious imitation" (Pitchfork).



Acclaimed as an "innovative composer, arranger, and big band leader" by The New Yorker, Argue's accolades include multiple GRAMMY nominations and a Latin GRAMMY Award, a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Doris Duke Artist Award, and countless commissions and fellowships.



Mike Holober

Described by DownBeat Magazine as "one of the finest modern composer/arrangers of our time," Mike Holober was awarded the 2022 American Academy of Arts and Letters Andrew Imbrie Award in Music. His 2019 release "Mike Holober and the Gotham Jazz Orchestra: Hiding Out" was nominated for a GRAMMY® ("Best Large Jazz Ensemble Album) and features two of his extended works for jazz orchestra.

In addition to leading his own band, Mike has served at the helm of some of the world's most renowned large ensembles as composer, arranger, and conductor. He was Artistic Director of the critically acclaimed Westchester Jazz Orchestra, and he has worked extensively overseas, writing and conducting for the hr-Big Band (Frankfurt, Germany) and the WDR Big Band (Cologne, Germany). Upcoming engagements include residencies at the Jazzcampus in Basel, Switzerland, and the Frankfurt University of Music and Performing Arts (in cooperation with the hr-Big Band). In November 2024 he will be arranging poem settings by Omer Klein for vocalist Rebecca Martin with the hr-Big Band, and in July 2025 he will be writing a project for the WDR Big Band, featuring saxophonist Chris Potter.

Amongst his honors, Mike is the recipient of a prestigious Chamber Music America New Jazz Works commission for "Don't Let Go," a song-cycle written for "Balancing Act," his jazz octet with voice. He was named the inaugural Stuart Z. Katz Professor in the Humanities and the Arts at The City College of New York in 2017, and he has enjoyed multiple artist residencies at MacDowell (2003; 2004; 2005; 2006; 2009; 2020), The Brush Creek Foundation for the Arts (2019), The Ucross Foundation (2007; 2019), and Yaddo (2005).

Mike is a full Professor at The City College of New York, and teaches composing and arranging at The Manhattan School of Music. He was Associate Director of the BMI Jazz Composer's Workshop from 2007 - 2015, where he taught with Director Jim McNeely, and he is an active member of the International Society of Jazz Arrangers and Composers (ISJAC), frequently featured as a presenter alongside luminaries such as Anat Cohen, John Clayton, Jim McNeely, and Danilo Pérez.

John Beasley

John Beasley is a versatile pianist, composer, arranger who began his career in his 20s backing jazz icons Miles Davis and Freddie Hubbard. Since then, Beasley has performed with a wide range of artists, including Dianne Reeves, Christian McBride, John Patitucci, Chaka Khan, Carly Simon, to name a few. He was music director for international tours with Steely Dan, AR Rahman (Slumdog Millionaire) and Queen Latifah and co-MD for Chucho Valdes La Creation tour.



Beasley's work as a composer-arranger-pianist extends beyond jazz with many credits in TV and film, particularly with 15-time Oscar-nominee film composer Thomas Newman in the upcoming Elemental (Pixar June 2023) and blockbusters 1917, James Bond's Spectre and Skyfall, Finding Dory, He Named Me Malala, Shawshank Redemption. Newman invited John to orchestrate & conduct his big band MONK'estra in Steven Soderbergh's Let them all Talk with Meryl Streep.

As an educator, Beasley is committed to nurturing the next generation of musicians. He conducts master classes at music schools around the world. His bands often are intergenerational. He has been fortunate to write commissions for Los Angeles Philharmonic's Youth Orchestra Los Angeles and Carnegie Hall National Youth Orchestra.



Ryan Middagh

Ryan Middagh is an innovative educator, composer, arranger, saxophonist, band leader, and clinician who has traveled the globe, sharing his unique blend of talents and musical influences with audiences and music students. A passionate advocate for jazz education at all levels, he pursues creative programming and is devoted to reaching diverse communities through jazz.

Middagh's career as a jazz composer and arranger is studied with accolades. His works have been commissioned by musicians and ensembles throughout the United States. Grammy-winning artists, DownBeat award-winning educational ensembles, and esteemed collegiate and professional groups have recorded his compositions. His diverse collaborations span from arranging for Victor Wooten, Wycliffe Gordon, David Paich, Caleb Chapman's Crescent Super Band, the Nashville Jazz Orchestra, and his Blair School of Music colleague Jeff Coffin. iJazz and UNC Jazz Press have published several of his compositions and arrangements.

Middagh's versatility shines through as a soloist, collaborator, and band leader. His performances have graced jazz festivals worldwide, including tours and shows on behalf of the U.S. State Department. He is a sought-after studio musician in his hometown of Nashville, lending his skills to various genres. The Ryan Middagh Jazz Orchestra, a platform for his new compositions and arrangements, features some of Nashville's most talented musicians. He has also released three albums as a leader, and his upcoming album "Tenor Madness" will be released on EarUp Records.

Ryan Middagh is the Director of Jazz Studies at Vanderbilt University Blair School of Music. Middagh is an artist and clinician for Yamaha, JodyJazz, and D'Addario.

Monika Herzig

In 1987, the pedagogical institute in Weingarten, Germany awarded a scholarship for a one-year exchange program at the University of Alabama to one of their students, jazz pianist Monika Herzig. Together with her partner and guitarist Peter Kienle, she arrived in the States on a one-way ticket, with one suitcase of belongings and one guitar in August 1988. nce then she has completed her Doctorate in Music Education and Jazz Studies at Indiana University, where she taught for three decades.



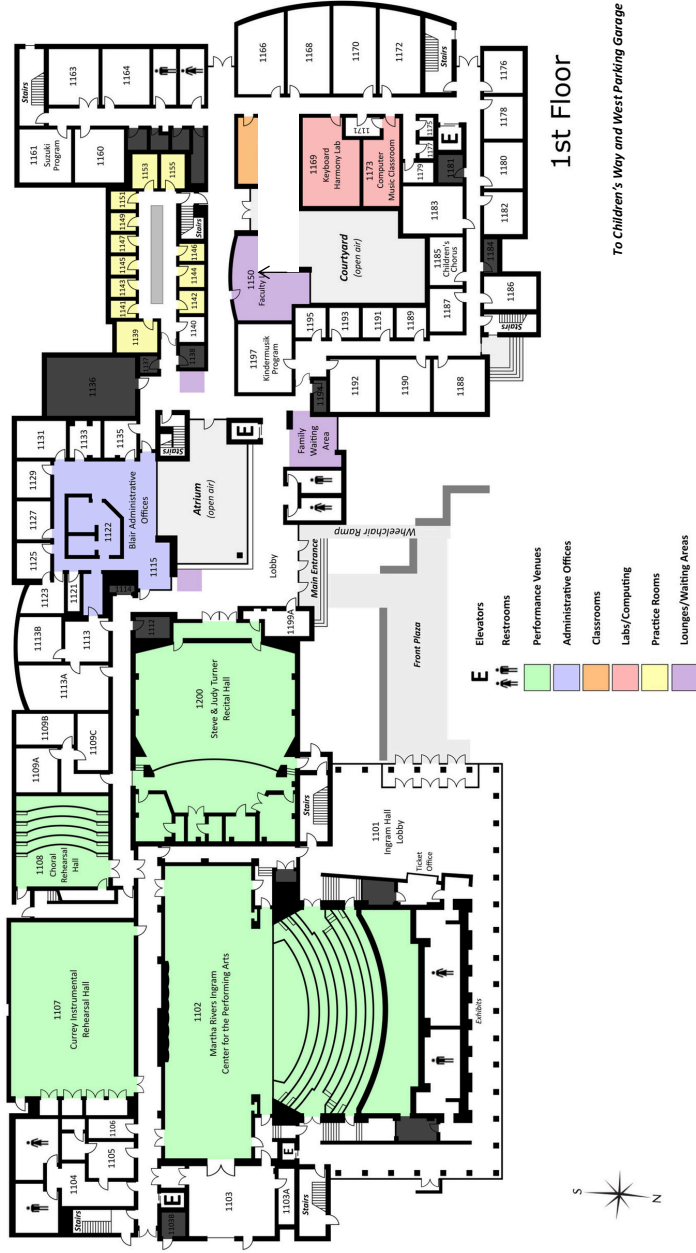

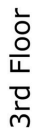


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First Takes

Sam Blakeslee Ephemeral

Sam Blakeslee is a New York City-based trombonist and composer. As a composer, In 2018, Blakeslee won the David Baker Prize in Composition from Ravinia Steans Music Institute and was also a 2020 COVID-19 Commission Grant recipient from International Society of Jazz Arrangers & Composers. As a bandleader, he has released 5 albums and in May 2023 recorded two albums of music with his jazz orchestra the Sam Blakeslee Large Group, both of which will be released separately at later dates.

Nick Finzer (with Rufus Reid) Legacy: A Centennial Celebration of JJ Johnson

Renowned as a "Rising Star" in jazz, Nick Finzer excels in original compositions and trombone virtuosity. Mentored by Steve Turre at Eastman and Juilliard, Finzer's accolades include Grammy nominations and Downbeat's "Rising Star Trombonist" title. As a bandleader with seven acclaimed albums, he founded Outside in Music to promote emerging talent. An Assistant Professor at the University of North Texas, Finzer shares expertise through books, masterclasses, and his YouTube channel. His latest album, "LEGACY," epitomizes his commitment to evolving artistry.

Steve Guerra Sete Anéis

Steve Guerra is the program director for Studio Jazz Writing at the Frost School of Music's department of Studio Music and Jazz. In high demand as a composer and arranger, Steve has been commissioned to write music for Dave Koz, Ben Folds, Jon Batiste, among others. His writing has recently been featured by the National Symphony Orchestra, the Inter Miami Football Club, the Nu Deco Orchestra featuring Met Opera star Will Liverman, and opera super group Il Divo's recent Christmas EP.

Sarah Jerrom Magpie Part VIII: Crystallization (For R)

Sarah Jerrom is a vocalist, pianist, composer and arranger specializing in jazz and creative music, taking inspiration from lyric-driven melodies, genre-defying instrumentation and experimental soundscapes. She has released 3 critically-acclaimed albums to date: Dream Logic (2021, TPR Records), The Yeats Project (2017) and Illuminations (2007). Sarah's new album, "Magpie," featuring her 90-minute suite for expanded jazz orchestra and 4 voices, will be released on Apr. 12th, 2024 on TPR Records.

Simon Lasky Closer To The Sky

British musician, Simon Lasky, is known on both sides of the Atlantic for his expansive jazz compositions and arrangements. He relocated from London, England to Tampa, FL in 2018 on the receipt of a Fellowship to study jazz composition with Chuck Owen. That same year he won the prestigious British Composer Award for his piece 'Close To Ecstasy'. In March 2024 Simon released his 3rd album as a leader on Ubuntu Records. He leads his 8-piece Simon Lasky Group in concerts in the U.K. and the U.S.

Pascal Le Boeuf Are We Dreaming the Same Dream?

Described as "a composer that rocks" by the New York Times, Pascal Le Boeuf is a GRAMMY-nominated composer, pianist, and electronic artist whose works range from modern improvised music to hybridizing notation-based chamber music with production-based technology. Pascal is currently an Assistant Professor of Practice in Music and Technology at Vanderbilt University, a 2023 Guggenheim Fellow, and Ph.D. candidate in Music Composition at Princeton University.

Remy Le Boeuf Stop & Go

Remy Le Boeuf is a 4x Grammy-nominated composer and saxophonist. Le Boeuf is the founder of the jazz orchestra, Assembly of Shadows, the Chief Conductor of the Nordkraft Big Band, and Co-leader of Le Boeuf Brothers. He has worked with a range of collaborators including the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra with Wynton Marsalis, Linda Oh, HAIM, JACK Quartet, Dayna Stephens, and Bob Mintzer. Le Boeuf is the Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Denver's Lamont School of Music.

Vanessa Perica The Eye is the First Circle

Vanessa Perica is a composer, arranger and conductor based in Melbourne, Australia. Primarily a big band writer, she has also been commissioned for string quartets through to symphony orchestras. Accolades include winning the APRA Art Music, Australian Jazz Bell, Music Victoria, and APRA Professional Development Awards. She has conducted performances of her music in Norway, and at the Sydney, Melbourne and Perth International Jazz Festivals.

Rufus Reid (with Nick Finzer) Legacy: A Centennial Celebration of JJ Johnson

Rufus Reid, a true renaissance figure in the arts, has been a prominent presence in jazz since the 1970s. With over 500 recordings, including 25 under his name, his contributions span genres. Notable releases like "Celebration" feature his jazz trio with a string quartet. Reid's versatility extends to composition, education, and accolades such as the Guggenheim Fellowship and Grammy nominations for his work. His influence as an educator is evident in pioneering programs like the Jazz Studies Bachelor of Music at William Paterson University.

Jussi Reijonen Three Seconds | Kolme Toista: III. The Weaver, Every So Often Shifting the Sands Beneath Her

Described as "a stunner... a single, unified, diverse, overwhelming statement" by JazzTimes and "unlike anything in memory" by AllAboutJazz, Finnish composer, fretted/fretless guitarist and oud player Jussi Reijonen's new nonet album, "Three Seconds | Kolme Toista" weaves an epic transcultural narrative between the open spaces of Arctic Lapland, the microtonal maqamat of the Arab world, the rhythmic richness of Africa and India, and the improvisatory spirit of American jazz.

Ross Strauser Endless Ties

Ross Strauser is a saxophonist, composer and educator who serves on the University of South Florida music faculty and teaches Jazz Saxophone, Jazz Composition & Arranging and Jazz Ensemble II. He earned his Master's degree in Jazz Studies with an emphasis in Jazz Composition from USF. Currently, he composes for and leads The Ross Strauser Jazz Orchestra, which released its debut album, Endless Ties, in May of 2023.

Drew Zaremba Blue Yonder

Selmer artist Drew Zaremba has composed and arranged pieces for the BBC Orchestra, the WDR and NDR Big Bands, the Vanguard Jazz Orchestra, and others. Drew joined the faculty of the University of Northern Colorado (UNC) jazz studies department in 2018. Drew's recently released "Reunion", his premiere big band album, produced by John Clatyon and featuring Wayne Bergeron, which was released through Outside In records in November 2023.

Christopher Zuar Exuberance

Christopher Zuar's music has been performed by the WDR Big Band, the Danish Radio Big Band, and the Brussels Jazz Orchestra. Zuar recently released 'Exuberance', a 60-minute song cycle for jazz orchestra and painted animation. Pianist Fred Hersch describes it as "a mature statement by a great composer in his prime, performed by a stellar ensemble with passion and care." Zuar is the recipient of the 2021 Symphonic Jazz Orchestra Commissioning Prize and the 2020 Copland House Residency Award.

New Music Workshops

Small Ensemble

Erez Aviram Quarantrio

Erez is a composer and pianist best known for "Elegy" and "Welcome to Addis", both received Hollywood Music in Media Awards nominations for Best Orchestral Work (2021, 2022). His most recent project is the Erez Aviram Ensemble, a chamber jazz group playing his compositions and arrangements. The ensemble had performed at the Rochester Jazz Festival 2023, Chamber Music America's Conference 2024 and Hartford Public Library Jazz Series 2024, and is planning to release an EP later this year.

David Bernot Never-Ending Cycle

David Bernot is a jazz composer and saxophonist currently based in Greeley, Colorado studying composition at UNC Colorado. He has received several accolades including two Herb Alpert Young Jazz Composer awards, and three Downbeat student awards. David took first place in the 2022 Carinthia International Jazz Award saxophone competition and has presented research and performances at the NASA (Saxophone) and JEN conferences. David's debut album "Never-Ending Cycle" was released in March 2022.

Zachary Bornheimer A New Chapter Unfolds

Saxophonist, composer, and GRAMMY® Award Winning Album Assoc. Producer Zachary Bornheimer has already built an international reputation for his intermixing of free, orchestral, fusion, Brazilian, swing, and post-bop jazz elements in his work yielding mainstream recognition with more than 500,000 streams of his compositions along with commendations from ISJAC, ASCAP, the VSA, and RSMI. Bornheimer's works have been influenced heavily by his studies and work with Chuck Owen and Maria Schneider.

Joseph Herbst Song of the Matsutake

Composer, copyist, & woodwindist Joseph Herbst uses music as a medium for storytelling. In 2021, he released his debut album, This is Our Environment, bringing together original music, spoken word, and environmental justice. Works in progress include his first big band album, Into the Void of My Dreams, exploring personal change through an original story of a person entering their Dreamworld, and his theatrical show, Ghosts in the Mirror, exploring internalized messages and how we handle them.

Masa Ishikawa San San Nana

As a pianist, Masa Ishikawa has performed at many jazz festivals/concerts including Italy, China and the United States. In summer 2023, Masa released his 2nd original piano trio album, titled First Note as well as the 3rd original sextet album, titled Montage. Several of his compositions have been published from UNC Jazz Press. He currently serves as an Assistant Professor of Jazz Piano at James Madison University. Past teaching includes Gustavus Adolphus College and University of Iowa.

Tom Larson Forbearance

Tom Larson is an Associate Professor of Composition at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, where he serves as the Area Head for Jazz Studies and Music Director and Composer-in-Residence for the Faculty Jazz Ensemble. Tom has performed worldwide at the Montreux Jazz Festival, the ISB Convention in Copenhagen, and the Tokyo Brass Art Orchestra in Tokyo. He has also written scores for numerous films shown on The American Experience (WGBH, Boston), American Masters (WNET, New York), and Nova (PBS).



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Robert Timothy Buonaspinas Chorinho em Vão Três

Robert T. Buonaspinas is a New-York-City-based composer, arranger, producer/music director, conductor/bandleader, multi-instrumentalist, and educator. As a composer and arranger, Robert has had the honor of having his work performed around the world. In January 2021, Robert was the recipient of the ISJAC Chuck Owen Prize in Jazz Composition.

Philip Ryan Goss Open Questions

Philip Ryan Goss is a composer, arranger, and educator residing in Brookline, MA. He is currently on the faculty in Berklee College of Music's Contemporary Writing and Production department, and holds an MM in Jazz Composition from New England Conservatory and a BM in Jazz Composition & Music Education from Berklee College of Music. Ryan's music draws inspiration from poetry, literature, visual art, and cosmic phenomena.

Bilge Günaydın The Dream of Scheherazade

Bilge Günaydın is a jazz pianist and composer based in NYC. She holds a Master of Music degree in jazz composition from William Paterson University. In 2020, her debut album "Daydreams" was released by receiving acclaim from "All About Jazz" as "an impressive first outing". Her second album "Sketches of Green" followed in 2022. Günaydın's projects have been featured at The Metropolitan Museum of Art, Flushing Town Hall NYC, Drom NYC, Istanbul International Jazz Festival, and many more.

Tom Haines Pickle Dance

Tom is a UK-based composer/arranger with a reputation for distinct original music for large jazz ensemble. Since 2013 he has won multiple national & international jazz composing/arranging awards, including the 2021, inaugural Sophie Desmarais Composition Award for 'Pickle Dance', performed by the Orchestre National de Jazz de Montréal. In 2020 'A Tall Tale' was nominated for an Ivor Novello Composer Award and in 2022 was invited to record three works with the NDR Big Band in Hamburg, Germany.

Takumi Kakimoto Two-Faced Dance

Takumi Kakimoto was born in Himeji, Japan, and started playing the piano at six. He was awarded a full-tuition scholarship from Berklee College of Music and graduated with a B.M. in Performance and Jazz Composition. He has studied composition with Miho Hazama, Greg Hopkins, and Ayn Inserto, among others. Besides multiple winnings in the ASCAP Herb Alpert Young Jazz Composer Awards, he has received various recognitions such as the DownBeat Student Music Award and the Yamaha Music Scholar.

Fabia Mantwill Sleeping Giant

Boundary-defying composer, saxophonist, and vocalist Fabia Mantwill (*1993, Berlin) reshapes the orchestral landscape with her own hybrid jazz chamber orchestra. She collaborates with the Metropole Orkest and Scottish National Jazz Orchestra and serves as Artistic Director for the Berlin YouthJazzOrchestra since 2022. Winner of the German Jazz Prize 2021, she received the Betty Carter's Jazz Ahead Residency in 2016. Her upcoming record features acclaimed soloists Anat Cohen and Kurt Rosenwinkel.

Desmond Ng We're Almost There

Born in Phoenix, Arizona, Desmond Ng is a highly active trombonist in the Nashville community. Desmond attended CSU Northridge where he received his B.M. in Jazz Studies and then relocated to Nashville where he received his M.M. from Middle Tennessee State University. As a performer he has recorded and performed with notable artists like Carly Pearce, Maren Morris, Dan & Shay, Joss Stone, Lauren Daigle, The War and Treaty and has performed in venues all across the world.

Dave Rivello Dave Rivello's Moving Stories

Dave Rivello is an American-born composer, conductor and bandleader working primarily in Jazz, and Contemporary Classical idioms. He apprenticed with Rayburn Wright, Bob Brookmeyer, Manny Albam, Bill Holman, and Sam D'Angelo. He leads a 12- piece ensemble (The Dave Rivello Ensemble) that is his main orchestral voice. He is the author of the book, Bob Brookmeyer in Conversation with Dave Rivello (ArtistShare), and also teaches at The esteemed Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York.

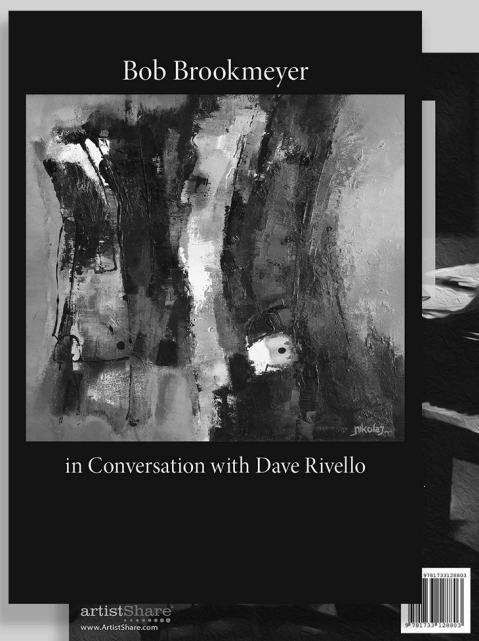
Paul Ferguson Comparing Thad Jones to Ellington/Strayhorn-a harmonic analysis

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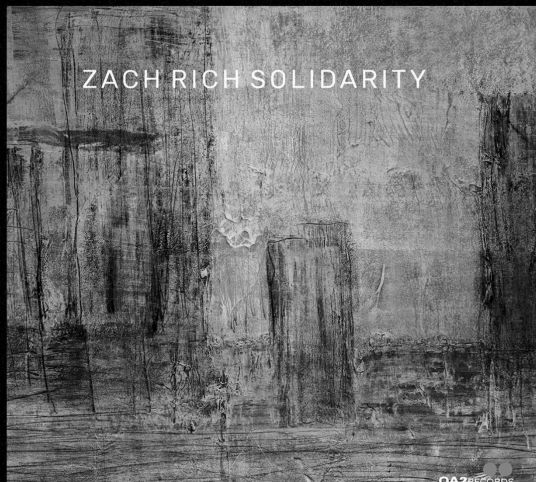

Applicants can choose between one of three main areas of study: playing in, writing for, or conducting a big band. Students who choose "writing" as their main focus get to record their music with the Frankfurt Radio Big Band from the first semester on.

Dan is a saxophonist, composer and educator. His work includes hit records in the UK, US and worldwide. Dan's roots are firmly in jazz, he's written and worked with leading jazz artists eg Soweto Kinch, Dave Liebman and Jasper Hoiby. Hendrik Viljoen is a performer, educator, and arranger based in Lincoln, Nebraska. He taught in public schools for eight years, and performs with local groups including The Root Marm Chicken Farm Jug Band and Clementine & the Meandering Oranges. His improvisational and compositional methods employ a synthesis of Barry Harris and Ernst Levy's concepts to create a novel approach to improvisation and composition based around symmetrical voice-leading and new harmonic motions.
